	volunteers of the club.

5	Welfare Report:	
	Sarah is constantly being contacted by email and sought out at	
	galas and asked questions that aren't appropriate to her role as	
	Welfare Officer, this may be due to her relationship with the	

	Chair. Sarah is to signpost the enquirer to the relevant person	
	to pick up.	
	The coaches have reported that there are a lot of girls from the Gold squad who are being cheeky, rude and disrespectful. The coach's decision to allow the swimmer to remain in the pool is final, this now needs reinforcing by telling the child why they are being spoken to and removed from the session or time-out. Coaches and Team Managers are unaware of any medical conditions and/or medication that swimmers need. Diane to compile a list possibly with the help from Alison Oliver. The list is to include current email addresses and contact telephone numbers. If a child becomes unwell whilst at a gala the parent can then be called to collect whether in the leisure centre or at home. A list of medical conditions and medication will be given to the Coach and Team Managers poolside for information. The contact list to be added to a protected area of the website. Team managers to improve their info and knowledge on swimmer issues.	Diane to email all and liaise with Alison Oliver.
	The club has recently been made aware of a swimmer who has now received a statement. Sarah is working closely with the family concerned.	
6	Morning Lifesaving: Dan is very concerned that some of the Lifesavers' qualifications have or are running out. This leaves the club's morning sessions vulnerable. The rules have changed meaning that there should now be two life savers during the morning sessions, one at each end of the pool. Committee will ask Daniel to take the qualification. The short term fix for this is asking the parents who stay at the pool during the morning session to take the "reach and rescue" training and remaining poolside during the session. 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	Yearly update is due, Diane and Barry working together to complete.	
8	Swim Collaboration:	

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	Barry met with Northwich and Crewe recently regarding creating a 'group'. The ASA are encouraging the Swim21 groups and feel it is a better use of pool time. The group will mean the training is shared, and will create a mini league for the younger swimmers. A gala will be held at each pool. At large events clubs can sit together. The next step is for the 3 coaches to meet up.	
9	Christmas Tree	
	St Chad's Church have invited WASC to display a tree at the church as part of the community. The tree can be real, false, made and can be up to 6ft, and the cost of entering a tree is $\pounds 10$ . The committee thought it would be nice for the younger children to make their own decorations and pay a pound as a contribution to the church. We are allowed to display any promotional material by the tree and thought it would be good if we bought a black tree and asked the children to create orange baubles. The trees will be shown from the 4-6 <sup>th</sup> December.	
10	AOB	
	December gala not going ahead owing to available pool time, instead a time trial for those swimmers chasing Cheshire times will be held on 5 <sup>th</sup> December. Sue needs info this week else it will be too late to apply for a license.	
	New swimmers going into the Juggernaut squad. There have been many complaints that the Juggernaut sessions are too busy meaning the swimmers are unable to train effectively. There is no space in the pool (57 Juggernauts) and Dan doesn't appear to be turning new swimmers away. Dan has stated that until told by the Committee to stop accepting swimmers he will continue. Barry to explain to Dan. Dual swimmers now to be offered morning only sessions. Juggernauts may need a 'mini' squad.	Barry to talk to Dan
	Some parents have asked for 1:1's with the coach like the Juggernauts recently had. Most clubs' coaches have 1:1's with the top squads, but the committee will ask Daniel to have a 10 minute group discussion with the other squads, either before or after training – poolside.	
	Some parents are still shouting from the balcony and undermining the coaches. On all media we need to remind parents of the code of conduct, and perhaps advise if this continues they will be asked to leave.	
	Thursday extra swim time will now be used for the Gold squad	

to relieve the pressure from Friday evening training. Monday evening's may be an option, but Barry will need to pursue with Brio. WASC now taking level 6/7 lessons having passed through Brio – currently 70 lessons.
